What's New this Summer? New Restaurants, Fish Market & Boutique Coming to Ventura Harbor Village

A food, beverage, entertainment and shopping renaissance is taking place at Ventura Harbor Village. Here's a review of "must visits" this summer:

◆ **Coffee Dock & Post**, Ventura's only waterfront coffee house, café, coastal gifts and postal services. Remodeled to take advantage of the spectacular mountain and oceanfront views of boats and harbor wildlife. Sit indoors or enjoy a new outside patio steps from the water. The new menu features café sandwiches, salads, coffees, pastries, smoothies and shaved ice with a beach vibe.

◆ **Boatyard Café**, a new restaurant offering hearty entrees for breakfast and lunch, a full bar, craft beers, Wi-Fi and live acoustic music on weekends, has opened in Ventura Harbor Village. The menu features delicious dishes and items, including homemade corned beef hash; the popular chicken fried steak; delicious charbroiled Angus burgers smothered with chili, onions and cheese; burritos; wild salmon and eggs; sandwiches; salads; chowders; appetizers like crab-stuffed mushrooms; and seasonal fish grilled or pan-seared. The restaurant boasts an iconic fisherman's bar open into the evening with a lighter menu and outdoor seating. Open seven days a week at 7 a.m. It's a refreshing, casual walk-in-and-order venue making it a "must-eat" spot for locals for lunch.

◆ **BlueWater Boutique** is the new sister shop to the

Scott Miller Retires; New Harbormaster, John Higgins

Much has changed in the Ventura Port District since Scott Miller left his job as a lifeguard in Long Beach to join the Ventura Harbor Patrol in 1980. Ventura Harbor Village was still in the development stage and a tiny wooden house served as headquarters for the Channel Islands National Monument (now the Channel Islands National Park).

Today, Ventura Harbor Village is a popular tourist destination with vibrant shops, galleries, restaurants and waterfront activities including harbor tours plus boat, kayak and paddle boat rentals. The Channel Islands National Park's Robert J. Lagomarsino Visitor Center welcomes about 200,000 visitors annually to view a display of

Beautification at Ventura West Marina

Ventura West Marina at Ventura Harbor completed a comprehensive remodeling project this year, transforming the marina into a modern and beautiful seaside spot for boaters and visitors to enjoy.

"We're excited about the project and the nice things we have done for our boaters. We have the best boaters," said marina General Manager Chuck Ormson.

Ventura West Marina offers 392 single concrete slips on the east end of Ventura Harbor. A separate marina on the western side offers 162 single wooden dock slips just 500 feet from the ocean. The marinas are walking distance to Ventura Harbor Village.

Improvements were completed to the buildings, restrooms, showers and laundry, landscaping and parking lots. The buildings were re-roofed and the exteriors painted. The Harbor Cove Café signs and sign lighting were upgraded and all exterior building lights and parking lot lights were replaced with LED fixtures. The Harbor Cove Café patron area and hallway floors were retiled. Restrooms were renovated as well.

Benches were added along the waterfront promenade and extensive concrete work improved sidewalks, curbs and gutters. New trees and shrubs were planted and the sprinkler system was upgraded. Approximately 115 existing palm trees were trimmed and over 70 new trees were planted. Curbs and speed bumps were repainted.

visitors on an underwater journey through several ocean habitats beginning at ground level with the dark and mysterious deep sea and ascending the stairwell to a breaching humpback whale at the third floor lookout tower. The journey exploring the ocean's resources and marine reserves in the national park is complete with a short dive descent in the tower elevator, complete with realistic sound effects.

Children will love the entry cutout where they take pictures of themselves as underwater divers before peering through a porthole door at bioluminescent creatures. The display includes murals, graphics and audio and light panels that depict the deep sea, open ocean, rocky reef, kelp forest, shore and surface marine environments. Videos introduce the ocean habitats, marine species and shipwrecks. The exhibit comes alive with light and the sounds of the

marine aquatic life and exhibits showcasing the unique character of each park island.

Miller, who became harbormaster in 2000, is proud of the Ventura Port District's transformation and achievements under his watch. Miller – the 2003 California Boating Law Enforcement Officer of the Year – retired in April.

John C. Higgins, a Ventura Harbor Patrol Officer since 1996, has been selected as the new harbormaster. The harbormaster's main job is supervising the Ventura Harbor Patrol, which provides 24-hour law enforcement, rescue and emergency services in the district.

Higgins has been involved in regional rescue response planning, fighting transnational maritime smuggling, homeland security efforts, statewide tsunami planning, and he serves on the California Boating Safety Officers Association.

The exhibit also features stunning images from many well-known Channel Islands photographers including Antonio Busiello, Richard Salas, Dan Harding, Robert Schwemmer, Shane Anderson, Jeff Bozanic and Tim Hauf. The displays are in Spanish and English and include tactile and sound features for disabled visitors. The Channel Islands National Park encompasses five of the eight Channel Islands (Anacapa, Santa Cruz, Santa Rosa, San Miguel and Santa Barbara) and their surrounding ocean environment. The Channel Islands are home to one of the most biologically diverse concentrations of marine life in the world – 2,000 plant and animals species including 60 species of marine birds, 27 species of whales and dolphins and five species of seals and sea lions. The Visitor Center welcomes about 200,000 people each year.

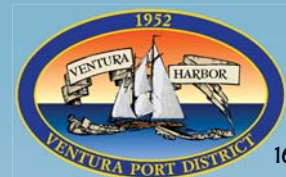
